Find Boats and Community at Surrey Park



Surrey Park Model Boat Club is one of our suburb's hidden gems; it offers the ideal relaxed Sunday morning watching model boats sailing around a tranquil ornamental lake. Perfect for little kids and not so little observers too!

Surrounded by trees, the lake and club house are tucked away between Aqualink Box Hill, Surrey Park playground and the site of the old Box Hill Brickworks.

The club was set up in 1988 but the history of the lake dates back more than 130 years to when the area was a quarry that was dug out for its clay; this was used by the nearby brickworks. At the end of the nineteenth century clay production was suspended for more than a decade and this deep hole filled with water, fed by an underground spring.

Surrey Dive, as it was known, became a popular but precarious local swimming spot. It hosted diving and lifesaving displays to crowds of people and was considered one of Australia's premier swimming venues until the 1930s when a purpose-built modern swimming complex was built next to it. During a drought in the 1960s the hole was drained to provide much-needed irrigation to trees in local parks. In the 1980s, the decision was made to fill in the hole and create a shallow ornamental lake.

The City of Box Hill asked the local community for expressions of interest for how to use the area and a small group formed to suggest a boat club. Just 15 people attended the first meeting but 35 years on there are 120 members. The club rents its club rooms from the council, using the venue for meetings and small repairs as well as displaying vessels. Head of the club, or Commodore, Gerard O'Donoghue said: "If you don't own a boat, you can try out one of the club's boats. Everything out on the lake is either powered by steam, electric motors or the wind." Petrol-driven motors are not allowed.

Once a year there's a competition split into yachts measuring under 750mm and models that are more than 750mm long.

With its serene surroundings and dedicated community, the club is a haven for enthusiasts of all ages and skills. Most models are between half a metre to three metres in length and cover a wide variety of types including fishing boats, yachts, tugs and fast electric craft.

My son and I were made so welcome when we popped down unannounced to visit the club. It feels like more than a gathering place bringing together a community of people who share a love of model boats. Seasoned sailor or newcomer, the club welcomes all with open arms, creating an inclusive and friendly atmosphere. I highly recommend a visit!

100 years of Mont Albert Medical Clinic

Dr Tom Hogarth, an elder at Surrey Hills Presbyterian Church and medical missionary, established a medical practice at 195 Union Road in 1923. When Dr Hogarth died in 1945, Dr Kemp – also a medical missionary - approached his widow suggesting that his nephew, Dr Linley Hare, might be interested in buying the practice. He had not mentioned this to his nephew, who was still serving as a medical officer in the air force. Mrs. Hogarth had agreed to sell the practice to someone else but gave Dr Kemp a 24 hour stay of sale.

Within the 24 hours, Linley Hare and his wife, Alice, decided to buy the practice, which included buying the house, and signed the documents. They then caught a tram along Whitehorse Road to Union Road to see what they had bought. In 1955 they moved the practice to its present site on the corner of Union & Mont Albert Roads.

Linley Hare died of a heart attack aged 52. Alice Hare continued working in the practice until 1995. Their son, Dr James Hare, joined the practice in 1978 and their

granddaughter, Dr Katie Weatherhead, joined the practice in 2010; both are still working there. Their greatgrandson Jonty Neil did his work experience there last year and is hoping to study medicine.

Past and present staff will be celebrating at a centenary dinner.







Firestorm

Greg Mullins

Greg Mullins fought his first fire alongside his Dad when he was twelve years old. He joined the NSW Fire Brigade in 1978, and stayed for 39 years, finishing as Commissioner, Fire and Rescue NSW. He still volunteers. This 2021 book, more than a memoir, includes his deepening understanding of how fires start, how they burn, and how and why our fire seasons have been changing.

Mullins gives impassioned accounts of the major fires he helped to fight throughout his life. As he recounts these battles, from his varying perspectives as he rises through the ranks, he also describes how the fires started to evolve. He saw that, from around 1990, fire seasons became less predictable: longer, with more intense droughts, and ever-fiercer fires. He recounts his meetings with environmental scientists, and his frustration with government inertia in tackling our climate emergency. The book climaxes with the giga-fires of 2019/20, when so much of the east coast was ablaze.

These again-timely recollections highlight how dangerous bushfires are becoming, why urgent action is needed to stop global warming, and how much we owe to our firefighters for the courageous, selfless work that they do on behalf of us all.

Then a mysterious package arrives in the post and uncovers a shocking past that explains so many attributes of Sally's personality and habits. 


